Assane Sow, from Senegal, lost his sight when he was just 2 years old after developing a cataract in each eye. Growing up, at a time when life should have been at its most exciting, he wasn't able to go outside on his own, join in games with the other kids, or take part in school lessons.

But after a simple operation to restore his sight costing just £27, he was able to go outside and play with the other children. Now aged 11, he'll soon be going to school with his friends.

This happy ending is just one of millions that Sight Savers has been able to make happen over the last 54 years. And with your help we can do so much more.

Assane's case isn't unique - in the world's poorest countries, extreme poverty and a lack of medical care mean that people are robbed of sight by conditions like cataracts, vitamin A deficiency and river blindness disease every day.
